The Beatitudes we find in the Bible are a group of blessings given by Jesus to His disciples during His Sermon on the Mount. He gave these Scriptures to us to encourage us and give us hope as we face each day. Each Beatitude looks at different circumstances of life and how all Christians are blessed through their faith. They also teach empathy and allow you to consider what it might be like to be in each situation. They emphasize good acts and they can be described as being a roadmap given to us by Jesus, showing us how to live by His perfect example. While we have heard sermons on this subject or done Bible studies delving into just what the Beatitudes entail. let's take a look at what OUR attitudes should be like when we are true followers of Jesus. In Colossians 3:17 we read this: "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." And lastly, Be a joyful attitude Christian. When God lives in our hearts, we must always work to keep our joy strong. When we start to do things our way, when we rely on our own strength and when our relationship with God slips a bit, joy can easily turn into misery.
