We Three Kings #254

Since Epiphany Sunday was last week, a time we reflect on the Wise Men and their coming to the Christ Child, we will do so this Sunday with this familiar hymn. We think of the three-fold ministry of Christ in this hymn, as prophet (telling God's message to us), priest (our coming to Christ to accept His forgiveness), and king (our sovereign who will rule the world in days to come at His return to earth). The three gifts of the wise men tell us of this: After an introductory stanza, the second speaks of the gift of gold, a gift of royalty to our Saviour, the King of kings, the third of frankincense which the priests would offer up as the prayers of the people, and the fourth of myrrh which was used to anoint the dead, a reminder of the death of Christ as the rejected prophet sent from God. The chorus is addressed to the star, asking to lead us from its guiding light to the "perfect light" of Christ, the light of the world!

O God, Our Help in Ages Past #117

As we face another year with its uncertainties for our nation and denomination, not to mention our families and ourselves personally, we need to ask our God to help us through the coming year. This hymn is a loose paraphrase of Ps. 90, the oldest Psalm, and written by Moses, who trusted God to lead him as he led God's people. It is a prayer, and sing it prayerfully as we seek our God's direction in the coming year.

Great is Thy Faithfulness #140

"Thy (compassions and mercies) are new every morning. Great is Thy faithfulness!" Jeremiah wrote these words (Lam. 3:23) as the Israelites were enslaved in a foreign country (Babylon), yet he predicted the return of the people to their own land. As we think of a new year, it is good to reflect on God's past blessings. In this prayer stanza one reminds us that as things are constantly changing, our God is not, but is always the same. He is always faithful to us. Stanza two tells of His faithfulness in the changing seasons of the year, and stanza three tells of His faithfulness in our eternal salvation and His daily guidance. As he has led in the past, He will lead in the future, for sure! Great is Thy faithfulness!

The Servant of the LORD

"Here is my servant, whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom I delight;

I will put my Spirit on him, and he will bring justice to the nations.

He will not shout or cry out, or raise his voice in the streets.

A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out.

In faithfulness he will bring forth justice; he will not falter or be discouraged

till he establishes justice on earth.

In his teaching the islands will put their hope."
