It has been over five weeks since we have not been able to gather in person. When I was preaching to empty pews of the sanctuary, I repeated to say in my thought that you are in the sanctuary because without your presence, I could not exercise lots of energy. Personally, I truly appreciate everything you have encouraged me with text and Facebook messages, notes and thanks cards.

You have recently heard that the state of Nebraska will start to re-open on May 4. Although some towns in numbers are still increasing, the good news is that we are overcoming this terrible virus with your great efforts. We can restart the worship service soon, if we abide by 6-foot distancing rule. However, since all of congregation's health is very important, we will have on-line worship service through the month of May. I will keep monitoring how it goes through May.

I DO recognize the important of the Holy Communion, as we have it every first Sunday of each month and special days. Recording worship service is inadequate to receive the communion because the communion is always "a live event by a certified pastor." So we plan to offer "Drive-Thru Holy Communion between 10:45 A.M. and 11:45 A.M., on May 3, first Sunday of May. I will perform the communion 10:30 A.M. by myself in the sanctuary. You can also participate in the communion through Facebook Live. The United Methodist Church upholds an open table. All are welcome to join to the communion table.

The first service at this church was held on April 19. The consecration service was held on Sunday, April 26. Although we could not join to this historical moment together at this church, I have enjoyed seeing pictures at Facebook for few weeks. I was very touched for your love and devotion to this church over 50 years. I really appreciate the team members who collect, search, find and compile pictures and articles. You will enjoy tons of historical picture of our church at a glance, when we have the 50th anniversary service.

As a pastor of Minden United Methodist Church, I appreciate your support for the ministry with devotions, prayers, offerings, specials funds and non-perishable items. I am looking forward seeing you with a smiling face, soon. This too shall pass.



Trust and Obey by Joyce Will

So what exactly does it mean to trust and obey? Can we have one without the other? And does it matter that we act on these words in our lives as Christians? How many of you recall the old hymn "Trust and Obey"? I remember singing this many times and I clearly recall the chorus of the hymn the most: "Trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey." Seems pretty basic and simple, doesn't it. In Psalms 33:21 we read this: "In him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in his holy name." The word - trust - is defined as "firm belief in the reliability, truth, ability, or strength in something or someone". Trust is kind of like faith and an example of that would be that we trust or we have faith that the sun will rise in the morning. The word - obey - is defined as "comply with the command, direction, or request of a person or law". When your dog obeys you, it will do as commanded by you - "sit", "roll-over", "shake". So here's the thing, It's not trust OR obey, it's trust AND obey. They really go

hand in hand and when you trust someone, you will obey them. As Christians, we are to trust and obey our Father despite times when we may feel like His rules and commandments are hard to follow and just downright restrictive. He knows that by human nature we find that *totally* trusting in Him isn't easy. But if we don't trust that God loves us, that He is "all wise and all powerful" and that He cares for us, we won't be very likely to obey Him, will we? The trust of God is much stronger, more reliable and consistent than anything or anyone we could ever attempt to trust here on earth! In Psalms 33:18 we read - "The Lord watches over those who obey him, those who trust in his constant love." When I was a small child, I usually did whatever my parents told me. I had no reason to guestion their reasons or their intentions. As I grew older, and I became more aware of what I thought were their flaws and imperfections,



I was less apt to obey and let's just say I became a bit rebellious. All of a sudden, I felt that I had a reason to doubt my trust in them. Throughout our lives no matter our age, we may find that obeying someone is a struggle because our minds tell us all kinds of reasons not to obey. When you put your trust in the Lord, that doesn't mean that your faith won't be tested. I believe that there will be times when God tests our faith so that we can learn that the only way to be happy in Him is to trust and obey. It's difficult at times to let go of our own wisdom and strength and totally count on <u>God's</u> wisdom and strength to guide our lives. You can tell for yourself whether you truly trust and obey God when you look at your own words and actions.




