I greet all of you in the wonderful name of Jesus Christ. I pray that all stay safe and healthy. From 28 people, we have received the survey regarding COVID-19 and our future. Thank you for your participation and for sending back the survey to us. You can see the survey results included with this newsletter.

The average attendance is in the 30s after resuming in-person worship on June 14, 2020. That is only 40 percent of the average attendance of 2019 that comes to worship service. About 20 people participate in live-streaming worship and about 50 people on Sunday watch the worship video. We send a bulletin and sermon script to those who cannot join online and in-person worship every week. Graciously, the number of offering (January through July) is slightly higher than in the last two years. We are more connected than you expected.

With this pandemic, I am not honestly sure about how we are going. I don't see our future transparently. Nevertheless, I have faith God is still working with, in, and through us. God has His plan to awaken and recover our church during this mysterious time. Moreover, I have seen a vision in this mist for today and tomorrow.

Previously, we waited for you in our church building. We had programs in our church building. If you cannot come to the church at this time, we can go and see you at your places. We can still communicate with each other via ZOOM and social media. I have looked back to my ministry at this church for two years. Now, we have to consider more time and energy for the preparation of the worship service. Repeating to attend worship service every Sunday is significantly important for our Christian livings.

The COVID-19 has made us turn inward and hold on. We canceled programs. We have worried about COVID-19 and waited to wish to go back to normal soon. Do not wait for returning normal without anything. Instead, it is time to navigate and walk toward a new way together. This pandemic will give another opportunity to be more revitalized. I, your pastor, cannot do the ministry myself, but I need you to come together for the revitalization of the church. You must return to our church. The return of each person will make me dance. I mean that you can at least come to the drive-in worship once a month. It is very safe at the drive-in service and I would love to see you all there, September 27, 2020. I believe that God is calling us to turn outward and reach out together.

Follower or Leader? by Joyce Will


Would you consider yourself a follower or a leader? I myself tend to be a follower for the simple reason that I'm not a real outgoing type of person. As a child, I was very content to hide behind my mother's skirts. I was at times painfully timid and shy, not wanting to be first, not wanting to stand out and certainly not being a leader. Instead, I was more than content to follow the leader. But then fast forward several years and I was a nurse.

Now that kind of a person needs to be a leader most all the time, from making snap decisions on your own to developing a plan and having everyone involved follow your leadership. That was sometimes a difficult thing to do because I was so much more comfortable being a follower than a leader. Have any of you ever been in a position such as that, to where you were suddenly put into the lead role with others following you? It's a place that could make or break you. The one scripture that I always lean on whenever I feel like I need strength and



courage is a familiar one to most of us. It's from Philippians 4:14 - "I can do all things through Christ Jesus who strengthens me." I can't begin to tell you how many times I quietly said that verse while I was at work in a tough situation and I still find myself almost daily repeating that when I'm in a hard spot.
