
Faith, Hope and Love by Joyce Will

Probably one of the earliest scripture we learned to memorize when

we were in Sunday School was the verse from 1 Corinthians 13:13 - "And now these three things remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love." 
it. But why are these three words grouped together? Can we have one without the others? Did God desire us to have all these three things in our lives? So let's look at faith first. It's meaning is found in
