Greetings Minden UMC,

I shared our church vision, goals, and strategies for this year on January 16. Let me write what I shared during that time.

I have served this church for over three years. And I realize we need to spend more time and energy on the Scripture because the Word of God in the Bible provides the power to live with faith. It is alive and active in our lives. That's the reason I set the church vision, "Expand our boundaries through the Word of God."

The church always needs disciples of Jesus to sustain and strengthen its ministry. One of the best ways to be his disciples is to live with the Word of God. And Bible study can be the first step to be his disciples. I will ask you again for the Bible study around April. If the number of participants is enough, I can lead the Bible study again.

Especially I encourage all church leaders to take the Bible study. Let me share our goals for this year. In the first half of 2021, the average worship attendance of our church was 35 people in person and 30 people online. So total numbers are 65. And the second half of 2021 went up to 48 in-person and 30 people online. The total numbers were 78. The offerings in 2021 were \$168,317, and in 2020 were \$167,585.

The reality that our church encounters is that much of our congregation is old. Many members have passed away since I moved to this church. Some members have moved to nursing homes or are homebounded. Some members have declined. So we must step up now in ministry.

We set a goal for the average worship attendance up to 60s in person and 40s online. We need 12 people more in person and ten more online. Then our average attendance will reach out to 100. The numbers are challenging but not impossible if we follow our strategies.

First, more church meetings are needed. We have good committee members for this year. I recommend church leaders to meet at least once every other month. We can share our gifts along with the meetings.

Second, we should invest more energy and time for young people, especially children's and youth's programs.

Third, more people, especially church leaders, should take the Bible study.

Fourth, come more often to the worship. We have enough numbers to make 60 people in-person worship. If you come one time a month, come two times a month, come three times a month.

Fifth, let us make our normalcy. We should choose the way we live together with covid-19. We encourage more congregations to return to in-person worship. We try to bring a return to our services and programs.

Sixth, we will consider a community dinner at least once a month. We can host the people of the community. It will be an excellent program to connect us with the community.

The Holy Spirit be with us as we go forward with these strategies in 2022.


