Brothers and Sister in Christ,

Nineteen children and two adults were killed in gun violence at an elementary school in Uvalde, Texas. Innumerable Ukrainians are injured and killed by the destruction of war. With Covid-19, we have suffered for over two years. Nebraskans lost people, houses, and lands with numerous fires across Nebraska. We live in a world of inequality, brokenness, and imperfection. Violence is always around us, and innocent people are victimized.

In these circumstances, the Lord's Prayer reminds me again of how we, Christians, live and respond to injustice. Jesus taught us how we pray with it. We can search for what Jesus wanted from us. We often consider the Kingdom of God in heaven, but we can see how Jesus focuses on the Kingdom of God in this world in his prayer.

God wants us to be holy as God is holy. Our holiness cannot be completed from the separation of the world because Jesus wants us to be the salt and light of the world. He loves peace as he is the prince of peace. The Kingdom of God is already started as Jesus came into the world. Our role is to achieve the kingdom of God through the support of the Holy Spirit.

When we receive more spiritual nourishment, we can work for God and our neighbors.

We can expect Russians and Ukrainians together without wars. We can expect the victims of gun violence are supported by the love of God. We can experience new hope in the burned areas of Nebraska. May God's blessings be upon them.




