

A really old time hymn came to mind one day as I was taking a walk. I started humming the tune and soon the words came along with the tune.

Many of you remember when you were kids in church and the entire congregation stood and sang out with praise while holding the hymn book in their hands. That often 4-part harmony sounded so good now that I think back to those days. And with so many of those songs I can clearly remember the words, at least the chorus to many of them. While I do enjoy the newer Christian music, there's still something about those hymns that we grew up with that holds a special place in our hearts. One such song was the one I referred to when I was taking a walk - "When the Roll is Called up Yonder, I'll be There" - what a wonderful hymn from long ago. So it was with that song that



makes us wonder, when the roll is called, will my name and your name be on it? The only way we will be on that roll is if we confess our sins and ask Jesus into our hearts. Romans 10:9-10 tells us: "If you declare with your

mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved." That seems like a straight-forward-easy-to-do direction to get "up yonder", doesn't it. So many of us go through life thinking that if we only do what is good, that will be enough to get us a spot in heaven. Right? Wrong! We can be as nice as can be, but if we don't have Jesus living in our hearts, we just won't be there; our name will be absent. I had a patient one time that was admitted shortly before I came onto my shift. He was dying and his family felt he needed the support that could be offered from a hospital; be it comfort measures at that time. He had many children and he was surrounded by them and his wife; the patient's room was filled. When I went to check on him, I found everyone standing in the hallway by his room. Wondering what was going on, I learned that he wanted to talk with a pastor. So one of the nurses called in a pastor from the community that promptly came down to talk with this gentleman. He gave him communion and read some scripture to him, then he left. All the family returned to his bedside, but one of his sons found me and asked to go to a room to use a phone. I took him into a room nearby, and then he asked me while he held up a Bible that he'd found in the room, "you're a Christian aren't you?" I told him that yes I was. He then asked if I remembered that in the Bible it says that there's a place in heaven for us. And again, I said yes. He went on to tell me that his father had just became a Christian and "he'll get to go to heaven, right, to one of those rooms?" I smiled at him, nodded my head and said "yes, your dad will go to heaven." That son was so joyful that his father was going to go to heaven when he died, which happened within a few hours after he became a believer. I was blessed over and over; there were so many, many moments that I will always cherish in my heart and know that I was so blessed to be a part of something good that God had done and my heart was full. My friends, the Bible teaches us that doing good cannot get us into Heaven. None of us could ever gain enough merit to deserve heaven as we are all sinful creatures. But here's the thing - it's never too late to ask Jesus into your hearts, to confess our sins and to follow His Word. It is then and only then, that when the roll is called up yonder, we'll be there. 
Wesley's Simple Rules for Money

You're probably used to hearing people in church talk about giving. But when was the last time in church that you talked about earning or saving? Is it unchristian to earn money? Is it wrong to save for ourselves and our families?

John Wesley didn't think so. Wesley, the Christian evangelist and founder of the Methodist movement, gave a remarkable sermon called "The Use of Money." Consecration Sunday will be November 13th. Following worship on November 13th a meal will be served in the fellowship hall.





Place a candle inside








