And as Christians we would have to agree that the Advent season is indeed a wonderful time of the year but also a really blessed time of the year for their church family. And while Christmas and/or Advent is a really special time of year, what about Easter? Think about this, folks. If there was no Christmas, we would never have an Easter, right? If there was no Holy birth, there would have never been a death on a cross and a resurrection; think of that for a few moments When I was a nurse, I loved taking care of the newborns. I was always so blessed to attend their births and to care for them and their new family; it was such a special time. I have no doubt that it was a special time at the birthing of Jesus, but without a clean place nor any nurses or midwives or doctors, nor family nearby, just Mary and Joseph and some barn animals to celebrate their newborn's birth. 
