The Meaning of Maundy Thursday

The Thursday before Easter Sunday, also called Holy Thursday, is a service to commemorate Jesus' Last Supper with the Apostles and the beginning of our sacrament, the Lord's Supper. The word Maundy comes from the Latin mandatum, which means "commandment."

At the Last Supper, Jesus gave the disciples a new commandment to love one another as he had loved them (John 13:34). Prior to breaking bread with the disciples, Jesus washed their feet. Maundy Thursday worship services include Holy Communion and sometimes foot washing as well.

Four events are commemorated on Maundy Thursday: the washing of the Disciples' feet by Jesus Christ, the institution of the Mystery of the Holy Eucharist (Holy Communion) at the Last Supper, the agony of Christ in the Garden of Gethsemane, and the betrayal of Christ by Judas Iscariot. After the Supper, Jesus went outside the Old City of Jerusalem and came to the Garden of Gethsemane. Because Jesus knew what would befall him, he prayed and wept, "Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet, not my will but yours be done." (Luke 22:42 – NRSV)
