Pastor Peter's Reflection on the Order and Fellowship Event

I attended the Order and Fellowship gathering from October 28-30 at the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas.

Above all, it was a joy to attend worship there without any sense of pressure. I learned a lot, and most importantly, I gained courage for ministry. The time spent connecting with other pastors, sharing experiences, and encouraging one another gave me renewed strength and inspiration for ministry.

At the Order and Fellowship event, the plenary speaker, Dr. Ashley Boggan, shared insights on the history of the church, particularly Weslevan theology. It was a powerful reminder that even in uncertain times, there is hope for our future.

Additionally, I had the opportunity to participate in a O&A session with Rev. Adam Hamilton, Senior Pastor of the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection. This conversation made me reflect on the importance of having a clear vision for our church, especially in the context of our own situation, and developing specific strate-

gies to follow that vision.

One of the questions that was raised during the event was: What does it mean to be "Methodist?" Dr. Boggan answered, "A Methodist is one who risks all to spread the love of God to

those who need it most."

This made me reflect on an important question: Is it always right to remain silent for the sake of peace? In Matthew 10:34, Jesus says, "Do not think that I came to bring peace on earth. I did not come to bring peace but a sword." Sometimes, if God requires it, I believe it is necessary to throw a stone into the calm waters.

As we look toward 2025, I believe what we need is not silence but a bold proclamation.
