Dear Minden UMC Family,

As I thought and prayed about a vision for our church in 2025, I became firmly convinced that the most important thing for us is to build a life of true worship.

Our vision statement for 2025 is "A Life Centered on Worship", inspired by Romans 12:1: "Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship."

I encourage you to reflect on how God is calling you to engage in worship this year. Is it by singing louder, praying more intentionally, serving others, or simply being present in the moment? Together, we can embrace this vision of worship-centered living and grow deeper in faith.

I look forward to journeying with you in 2025, trusting in God's faithfulness and grace. Let us make this year a time where worship leads us closer to Christ and to each other.

New Sermon Series: Living the Questions: A Journey Through Faith and Life

In February, Pastor Peter will lead a four-week sermon series based on topics you are interested in. As Christians, we often wrestle with balancing our faith and the realities of life.

There are times when it's difficult to know where we should stand, especially in areas like the relationship between science and religion, how we should view war, or even how unbelievers perceive Jesus. We also frequently hear the phrase "God is in control," but as Christians, we sometimes face suffering ourselves.

I'm sure many of you have questions about these topics. From your feedback, I'll select four key themes to develop a sermon series that speaks directly to your interests and spiritual journey. Stay tuned, and I look forward to hearing your thoughts!

- 1. Faith and Science: How do they intersect, and can they coexist? Is science threatening to faith, or can both explain different aspects of truth?
- 2. Faith and Doubt: Is it okay to doubt? How can faith coexist with periods of doubt and questioning?
- 3. The Problem of Evil: If God is good, why is there so much evil in the world? How can Christians reconcile God's goodness with the existence of suffering and injustice?
- 4. Social Justice and Faith: How do Christians respond to issues of racism, poverty, and injustice? What is the Church's role in the world today when it comes to social issues?
- 5. War and Peace: How should Christians understand and respond to conflict, especially in today's world? What does the Bible say about war, peace, and justice?
- 6. The Afterlife: What happens after we die? A deeper look into Christian views on heaven, hell, and what the Bible says about eternal life.
- 7. How Unbelievers View Jesus: What can we learn from their perspective? How does the world see Jesus, and what can we learn from their views to better share our faith?
- 8. The Role of Women in the Church: What does the Bible say about the role of women in ministry and leadership? How should we approach this issue in modern times?
- 9. Is Christianity the Only Way? What about people from other faiths? What does it mean to claim Jesus as the only way to God in a pluralistic world?
- 10. Money and Faith: How should Christians view wealth and poverty? What does the Bible say about money, materialism, and generosity?
- 11. Perceived Errors in the Bible: What do we do when we come across apparent contradictions or errors in Scripture? How should we approach these moments and reconcile them with our faith? Is the Bible inerrant, or are there deeper layers of meaning that we need to understand?
